## Series Of Three Workshops

### What:

In the learning context, culturally responsive pedagogy encompasses the need to care for children and young people as culturally located human beings through providing a safe, nurturing environment. In the New Zealand setting, the understanding of Manaakitanga needs to be extended to include developing and sustaining language, culture and identity to ensure all students have the opportunity to learn and experience success (ERO school evaluation indicators, p15).

These workshops will focus on enhancing knowledge and practice of cultural awareness, understanding and responsiveness. It will support participants to link current school practices with theory and research in order to review and enhance systems and processes at both the school and classroom level.

#### Workshop Content

- What is culture and cultural responsiveness?
- Eight suggested strategies that engage Maori learners
- Review of systems and processes to enable Maori to achieve success as Maori
- Planning for action – so what, now what?
